I can't believe it's been three months already since we started our term. We started in difficult times, the Executive Board was not able to meet physically. But we were lucky enough to already have known each other beforehand, despite that, we had many teambuilding activities which were necessary for a good start this year.

As I was in the Executive Board one year ago as well, I can tell you that our organization is improving and evolving on a 300% speed compared to one year ago.

In these 2 last months I was involved with the 4 vice presidents in several activities and projects, Would you like to know what I have been up to?

In October, I organized a meeting with KU Leuven which is our main sponsor I made a presentation about IAAS and with the rest of the EB, we discussed with the dean and the administrative staff about ways to improve our relation.

I represented IAAS on several occasions such as the FAO 27th COAG session which is one of the most important meetings at FAO, then I attended the ICA General Assembly and Forum. ICA unites all European Life Science Universities,

I was representing all the students from Life Science Universities worldwide, through that event I had the chance to meet many deans/rectors from European universities. I also participated in the IFISO autumn meeting. IFISO is the informal forum for international student organizations, the meeting that was held in October was a good opportunity to network with similar organizations from different fields of study, to think about new ways of collaboration and to help each other.

I created the simplest Standard Operating Procedure for new candidate members in accordance with CBL with the help of the rest of EB and CB especially the membership officer. It will help new applicants for candidate membership with their application procedure as efficiently as possible. IAAS Colombia was the first one to be proceeded with this new system.

On top of that, I tried to support our committees all over the world from all the regions as much as I could by participating, speaking in their events or helping them by one way or another. I have also been involved in bringing our Village Concept Projects to the spotlight by initiating 5 Village concept projects in Nepal (2), Morocco, Zimbabwe and Ecuador. Stay tuned for more information!



With the help of an alumni and previous IAAS President Mirjam Troost, I got in touch with the ministry of foreign affairs of the Netherlands and together we are organizing a Youth in Agriculture pre-event to the Climate Adaptation Summit taking place in January under the topic: 'The importance of youth engagement in enhancing the climate adaptation & resilience in agriculture and promoting food security for all' with a special focus on the African continent. For that I recruited an international organizing committee to organize a diverse and outstanding event! More information will be shared soon by the OC.

With other student organizations from the World Healthcare Students' Alliance, I organized and represented IAAS in the First Global AMR Youth Summit (Nov 20-22), this was so far the biggest event IAAS ever organized, we had 2500 participants from 120+ countries, additionally the event had high level speakers from WHO (Assistant Director General), FAO (AMR focal point), OIE (Deputy Director General), UN (Assistant Secretary General), UNEP, UNICEF, ReAct and more! IAAS was part of the first youth declaration on

antimicrobial resistance which was supported by these organizations! I presented our policy recommendations regarding AMR and the environment and moderated a high-level roundtable on the same topic.

It is so hard to write here all what I have done as it has been so busy these two months, but I tried to write the essentials. You can always reach me out for more information or in case you need any help!

In the upcoming weeks, I will continue to represent our organization with external stakeholders and try to bring new interesting opportunities for our members, I will work closely with host committees of scientific events, continue working on our global projects with the project coordinators, and most importantly continue leading and directing the work of our EB.

I hope to see all of you soon, hopefully in person!

It has been several months since I took the position of VPE at IAAS World, I must confess that an international position is a demanding task of great time and effort. It requires creating a global vision, beyond the local, to understand the different realities of different countries, which leads me to seek new strategies and activities. Now I have formed my team where the Regional Exchange Directors with whom we have been working very closely are also part and we plan to organize an Agrotourism congress (very soon they will have more news of that), where each country will have the opportunity to show its agriculture and its tourist wealth so that many members will be able to know about each country and motivate the itself to travel.

On the other hand, it is nice to tell you that a new version of the catalogue is about to come out where you can find the active exchange places around the world. I know well that the Pandemic is not over, it is a very difficult situation for each country and I also imagine that for each of you, but I hope that soon a vaccine

will be found and all this will be solved, so that many of you can travel, despite the reasons for an exchange. I speak for Ecuador and we have started our application process to receive two boys from Belgium by July 2021. Perhaps because of a lack of management or the very lack of knowledge of the members of their existence, but I assure you that it will soon change.

As I already said, I had to get familiar with a lot of financial and legal aspects of IAAS: I managed to register the new Executive Board (EB) at the Belgian court and bank, so that what we do is legal, I started doing the bookkeeping, helped countries paying their Membership Fee from last year, did some investigations on PayPal and read some useful sources from previous VPFs about all kind of financial topics. Besides this, I updated the handover documents already, so that the next VPF will even have a more easy start. I organized myself with the Regional Finance Coordinators in the Finance Team, having biweekly meetings, and

believe me: they are already doing an amazing job! Because, they really have an amazing impact on the ideas of how to improve the financial situation for everybody in IAAS. Further on, I also had more general jobs as an EB-member, like assisting the Vice President of External relations (VPER) in a sponsorship strategy, having meetings with our website developer, which will soon be launched (!). I further helped IAAS Belgium in organizing the first of a series of amazing scientific events: Beer&Sustainability, which was really wonderful!

The last thing I want to talk about is the WhatsApp group for all National treasurers and all others responsible of Finance in IAAS: this is meant to have at least one person of each country in it, not only to be able to share all our future work to you, but also to have questions and answers and to have some casual talks and brainstorming evenings about our financial strategies.
