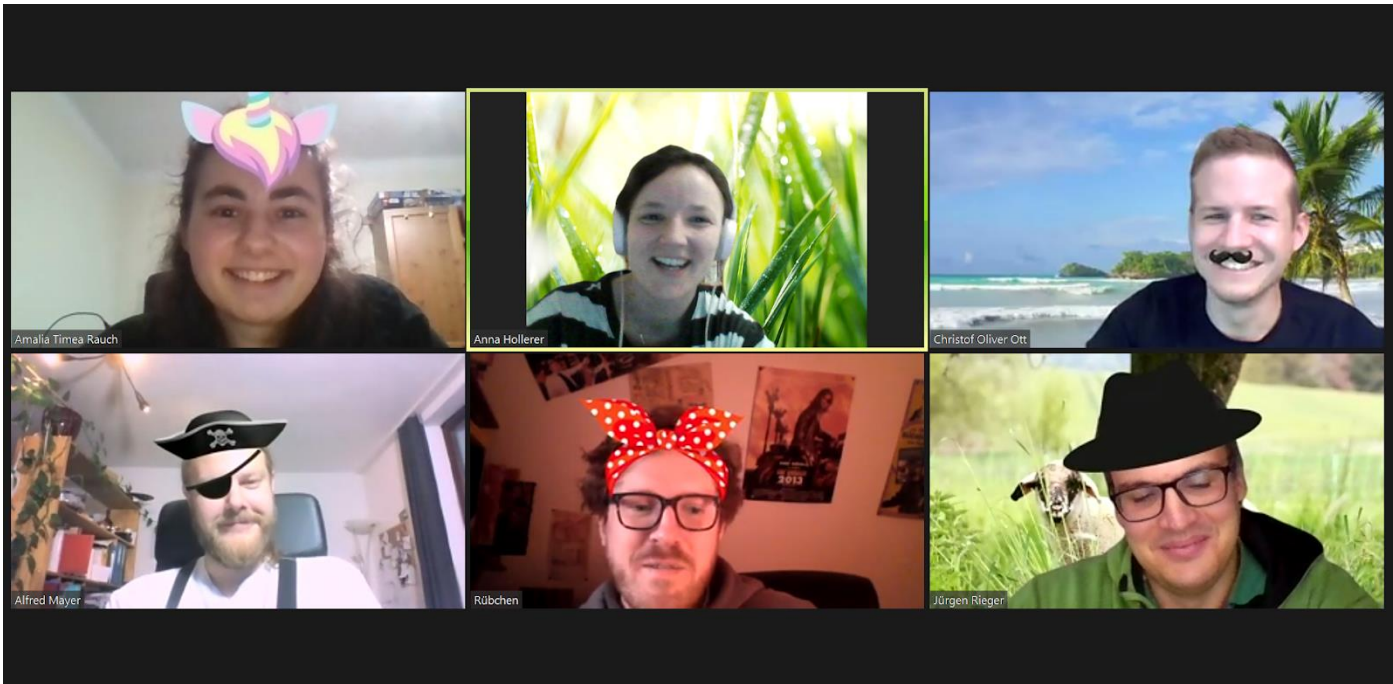

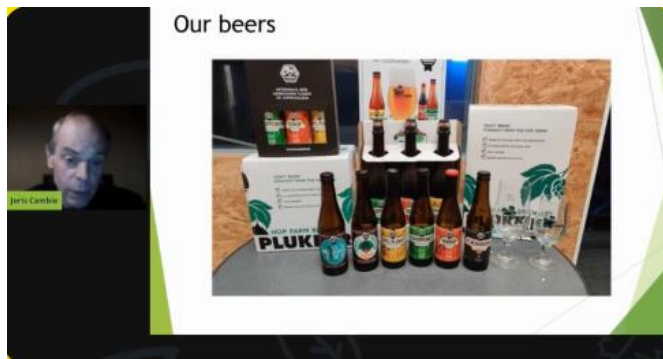
Hello everyone!

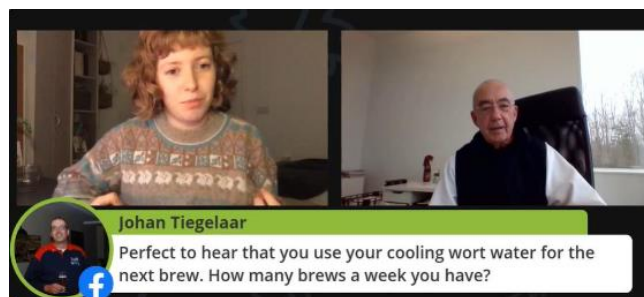


Beef & Sustainability Event 9- 11 November 2020, Online- Facebook

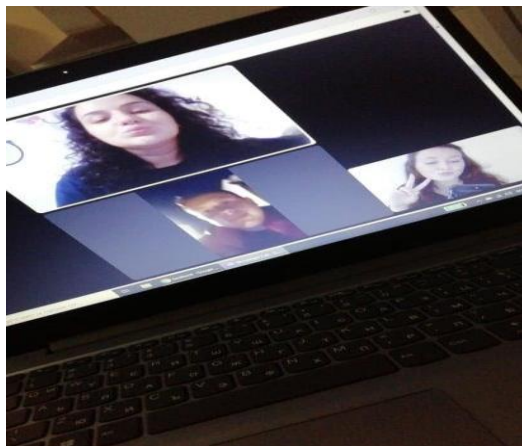


Hello, young people!

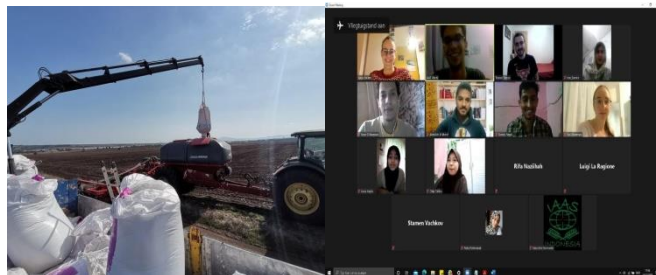

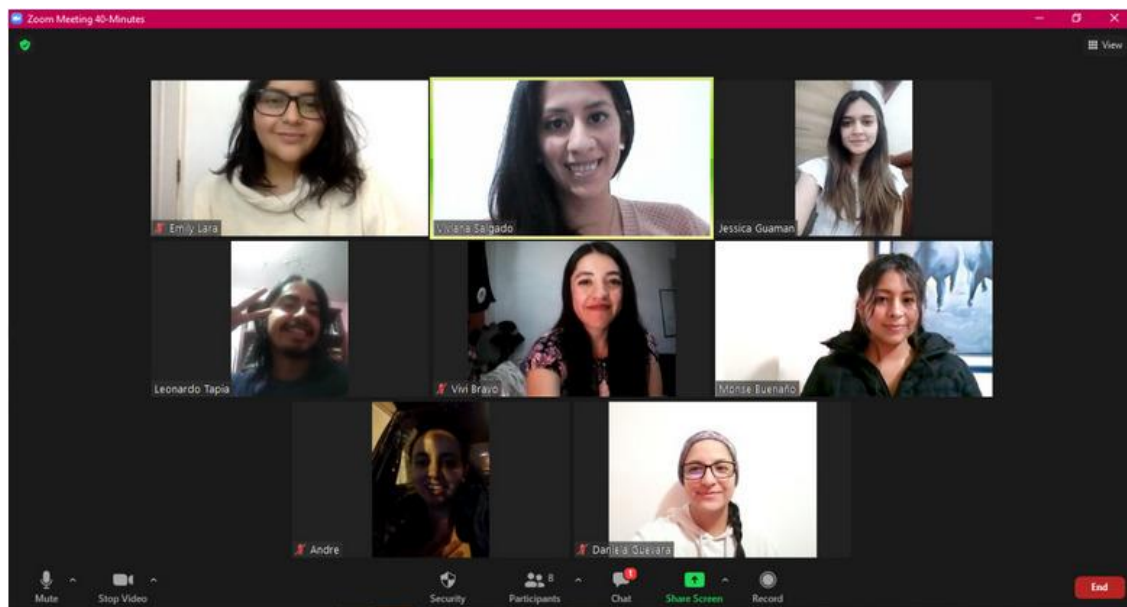

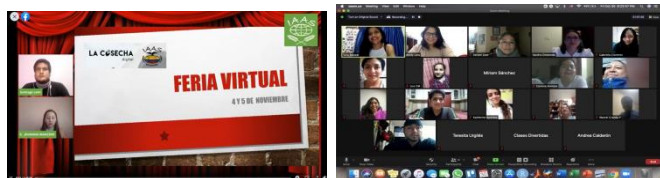
Entrepreneurship and Training Fair

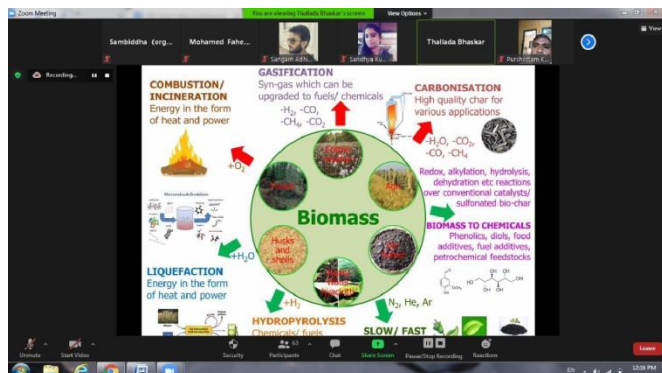

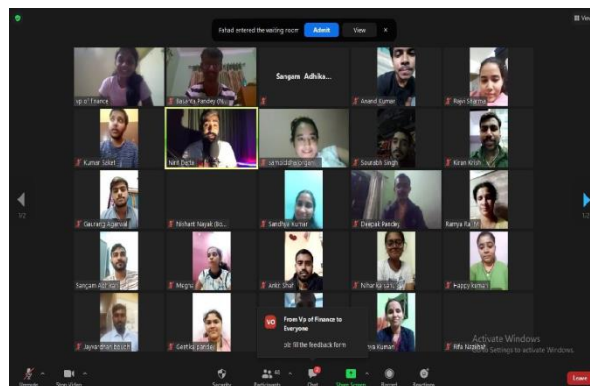

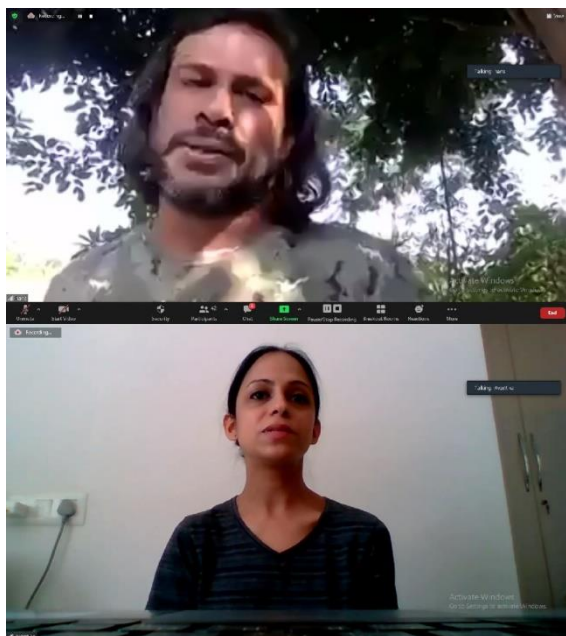
Farmers Cooperatives across the globe

- 48,000 cooperatives serving 120 million people in the US, whereas globally some 750,000 cooperatives serve 730 million members.
- 75% of French farmers belong to at least one cooperative.
- Cooperatives accounted for 37% of the workforce, 33% of sales turnover and 21% of transformation turnover in the food-processing sector in Europe.
- Many types of cooperatives have been established worldwide to serve the interests of members, including consumer, producer, worker, and service cooperatives.

Mr Puneet Singh Thind is the founder and director of Northern Farmers mega FPO, Chandigarh. He is a young and educated agribusiness professional. He was awarded and felicitated by Indian Council of Food and Agriculture with a National Award on Agriculture Marketing. 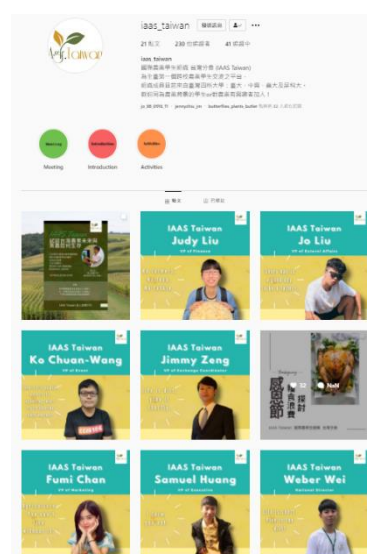


Greetings from IAAS Taiwan

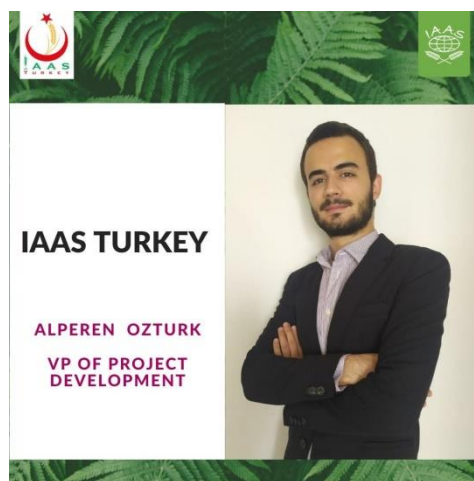
