# **IAAS 62<sup>nd</sup> World Congress**

## **Cote D'Ivoire**

July 2019



### 1<sup>st</sup> General Assembly July 13<sup>th</sup>, 2019

The first session started with the OC (Organizing committee) presentation and the event overview, followed by the GA welcome speech from the President, Natalie Bidner.

In this day we also did the election of the chairpersons and secretaries and all the candidates were elected by the majority of the present participants. The chairpersons and secretaries are as below:

In the first day of General Assembly, the main topic of discussions are all about explanation regarding the General Assembly voting system, GA Report from World Congress 2018, and ended with the membership overview session.

As the membership review discussion, we concluded the new IAAS candidates member per July 2019 are; DRC, Liberia, Peru, Bangladesh, Egypt, Nigeria and Ukraine.

## Flying Towards Agricultural Transformation

IAAS World Congress is our annual event that gathered all IAAS member across the globe. The 62<sup>nd</sup> IAAS World Congress was held in Cote D'Ivoire with the theme **"Flying Towards Agricultural Transformation"** was happened in July 12<sup>th</sup> until 27<sup>th</sup> of July 2019.

Besides new countries joined IAAS as candidate members, we also voted some previous candidate members become full member of IAAS, and for the current full members who already paid their membership fee to IAAS World. The full member countries per July 2019 are; Benin, Nepal, Niger, Indonesia, Morocco, Cote D'Ivoire, Ghana, Guatemala, Bulgaria, Croatia, Mexico, Taiwan, Chile, Greece, Italy, Portugal, Spain, Austria, Belgium, France, Germany, Netherlands, Sweden, Switzerland, and USA.

Some countries were not able to pay their membership until July, but we decided to extend the payment deadline until September 30<sup>th</sup>. The current new full member statuses after September 30<sup>th</sup> are; Togo, Kenya, Tunisia, Zimbabwe, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Paraguay, Serbia, Poland, and Slovenia.

The first session for today General Assembly was started with Regional Report's that presented by every Regional Directors of IAAS. There are 4 region in IAAS which are Africa, Asia Pacific, Americas, and Europe.

The first Regional Report was presented by Regional Director of IAAS Europe which is Hanna Roenneke (IAAS Germany). Hanna explained that she and her team in regional were preparing for the next European Directors Meeting, doing partnership with EGEA, promoting Exchange Program and Development Fund, and also arranging lots of events in Europe during 2019. As for July 2019, IAAS Europe already had 17 full members with two new candidates (Ukraine and Belarus), with more than 400 active members and providing 18 Exchange Program spots in 9 countries in Europe.

After the presentation from European Region, the next regional report presentation was from IAAS Africa. The report was presented by the Regional Director of IAAS Africa which is Aminou Abbas (IAAS Niger).

Aminou explained that IAAS Africa has been in contact with 21 African countries, promoting IAAS to other universities across Africa through social media, and organizing lots of events which focuses on agriculture livestock, environments, and leadership management. IAAS Africa also has 11 Exchange Places in 5 countries.

Finished with the closing speech by Aminou Abbas, the next report is coming from IAAS Asia Pacific which presented by the Regional Director of IAAS Asia Pacific, Bagus Kresna UDK (IAAS Indonesia).



**Asia Pacific 2019/2020)**

Bagus explained his current regional status in Asia Pacific with 5 country members in a video format. The programs that IAAS Asia Pacific already accomplished were regional online meeting, Hello Asia Pacific, and many projects that held by National Committee such as National Congress, Field trip, Debates, and Volunteering activities called Village Concept Project. The IAAS Asia Pacific committee also created bi-monthly newsletter called What's Up Asia Pacific to keep the members updated and lastly the online campaign that contribute with Climate Change Action.

The last regional presentation was presented by the Regional Board of IAAS Americas with the help of Natalie Bidner in explaining the details of the report.

## IAAS World Café (SDGs Workshop)

The next session is called World Café or Workshop about SDGs. There are 4 SDGs topics discussion during this workshops: SDG 2 Zero Hunger; SDG 4 Quality Education; SDG 11 Sustainable Communities; and SDG 13 Climate Action.



### SDG 2 Zero Hunger: CounsellIAAS

**Objective:** Raise awareness about food production and food consumption, and make it more sustainable through the creation of a network. We need a responsible conception and production of the food; we should focus on giving advices to farmers because we are producing enough food at the world scale to achieve zero hunger.

Many foods are stored before being sold and part of it can be wasted. The consumers have to be educated, and learn to eat more locally, hence the creation of a network to link consumers to producers. The farmers can be given advices (to choose the crop and how to cultivate them), as well as the consumers (about eating locally and seasonal products).



## SDG 4 Quality Education: EduQuat

**Objective:** Contribute to girl emancipation, increase girl participation in schools, and teach to parents the importance of girls' education. Education is an issue especially in rural areas, and girls often have a worse access to education in those areas.

This education could be provided through voluntarily organized summer schools, with trainings about basic knowledge of agriculture. We could also inform parents to use new technologies in agriculture, which allow needing fewer workforces. To explain the importance of girls going to school to parents, examples of successful women stories can be used.



## SDG 11 Sustainable Communities: ComClean

**Objective:** Clean the air in cities encouraging people to plant trees. Many improvements have to be done to allow better life conditions in always growing cities. We decided to focus on the air pollution issue, which affect citizens in their daily life. Vegetation being a good way to reduce air pollution, we focused on how to put more greens in cities to help cleaning the air.

The project would be held in countries / cities where IAAS comities are located. It would be done through social networks, to reach a maximum of persons. The project could be held a specific day where everyone would plant trees together, and we'd ask people to plant trees in parks or theirs gardens within the city, or nearby the city. The consequences would be a cleaner air and a greener city, both improving the life conditions of citizens. A side project would be giving advices on how to reduce air pollution will easy things to do, such as reduce the temperature of the air conditioner.





## SDG 13 Climate Action: Climaculture

**Objective:** adapt agriculture to climate change through advices to farmers. Climate changes affect the world and agricultural systems, so we have to raise people awareness about climate change and how to put solutions into practice in agricultural systems.

The methods would be various, such as planting trees around the world, restore lands, make people aware about climate change, and collect success stories from farmers to encourage others.



## 3<sup>rd</sup> General Assembly IAAS Activities Report July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2019

### Exchange Program Explanation

In this session we were talking and discussing about the Exchange Program activity in IAAS. The topic are mainly to discuss about on how to make the Exchange Program system more efficient in terms of promotional activities and discussion about the flows of Exchange Program in overall.

### Study Abroad Program

The session continued with the discussion about Study Abroad Program. This program is one of IAAS program which to engages and motivates students and members of IAAS from all over the world to study in the faculties and universities; The VP External Relations 2018/2019 Sadat Amankona (IAAS Ghana) explain everything about the Study Abroad Program in IAAS.

The Study Abroad Program is here to bridge the information between universities and the students and is as much as we promote the universities, we encourage our members to chance on the opportunity and apply for admission.

### ICYA (International Conference for Youth in Agriculture)

The session continued with the session about ICYA. Established in 2017 as an annual program for IAAS members with the focus of solving problems in relation with the SDG goals. It is also stipulated in the constitution. ICYA is a short science oriented event covering SDG Presentations, Lectures, Keynote Speakers and Debate. ICYA to be held annually, the EB and the hosting country are responsible for the organization.

## IAAS Training Committee

IAAS training Committee provides training on projects such as how to make a fund raising or how to organize events. Till Zimmer(Switzerland) is the head of ITC and they form people to learn non-formally soft skills, with 13 trainers, 12 junior trainers and 6 alumni. ITC empowers IAASers to earn skills they might not earn with their university curriculum, acquiring skills and knowledge your universities don't provide in schools.

## Organizing Committees for World Congress 2020 and Exchange Coordinator Meeting 2020.

Discussion continued with the discussion about the next organizing committee for WOCO 2020 and EXCO Meeting 2020. IAAS Portugal applying for WOCO 2020. The country has many local committees for such a small country. The last World Congress they organized was 19 years ago. They have experience in organizing events, and successful exchange week in 2019.

Next host candidate is for EXCO Meeting 2020 where IAAS Chile presenting their application to be the next host for EXCO Meeting 2020. Chile has a diverse climate and geography in this country, native + Spanish influenced culture Agriculture diversity thanks to the climate, Exco Meeting will be organized in Santiago & Valparaiso. Another candidate also coming from IAAS Guatemala for EXCO Meeting 2020. Guatemala is a volcanic country's with very diverse culture and agriculture which is the main economic activity, has many innovations for this domain, and has many projects on environment sustainability that connected with SDG 13.

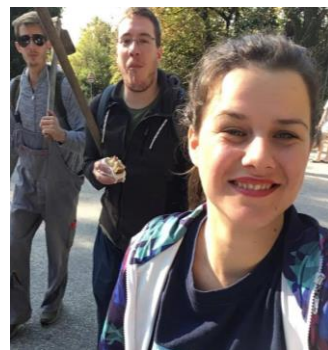

October 19<sup>th</sup>, 2019 (Patuakhali, Bangladesh)



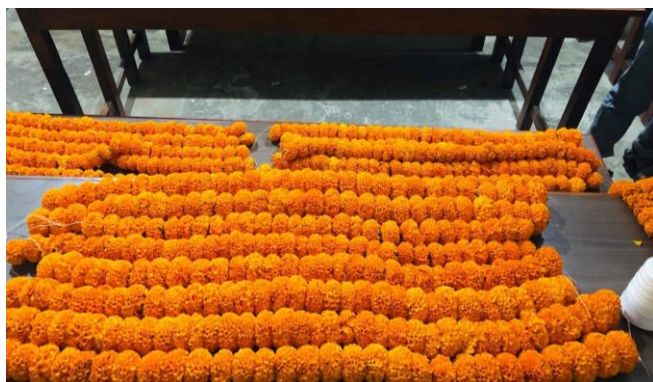

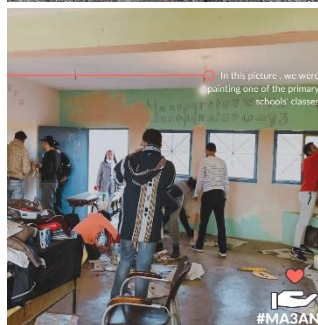
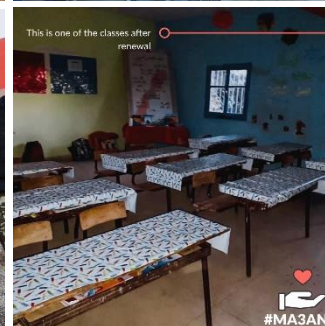
## Village Concept Project initiative called #MA3AN

### 9th ICA Rectors and Deans Forum 2019

### Collaboration between European & African Life Science Universities for a Sustainable Future

October 24<sup>th</sup> – 25<sup>th</sup>, 2019 (Beauvais, France)



The 24 and 25 of October, I have represented IAAS World at the ICA Forum in UniLaSalle in Beauvais. The organization was held by the last year students of Beauvais. They are really sympathetic, and I explained them a little what was IAAS. Many directors of European and African universities were present at the forum. The subject was the cooperation between European and African universities for research and education. The goal was to identify the mutual benefits that can emerge from a cooperation between Europe and Africa and how to achieve it through projects. In this report, I will resume the program of Thursday and Friday and focus on the points that I found interesting. Then, I will write some thought that I had during this event.

### Introduction to the forum

The forum will put the steps to achieve the objectives of the Agenda 2030. To do this, the partnerships between Europe and Africa will face challenge and will have to grab opportunities. There is not a unique answer to these issues, but each continent can bring its own perspective and knowledge.





## Overview of challenges facing African agriculture and life science universities towards 2030:

**Perspectives from South/Southern African region, Daniel Brink Stellenbosch university South Africa**

The goals of African universities for 2030:

- Respond to a demand for affordable, accessible and good quality education
- Increase the focus on science, technology, engineering and agriculture
- Increase the flexibility and transform the way of teaching
- Change the nature of funding models

The challenge and objectives of the African universities:

- High cost of education: reduced government funding => Diversification of the funding model
- Competition/globalisation: importance of international network => International partnership
- Multiple stakeholders: divergence of stakeholder interest (private funding) => Public/private partnership
- Complexity of research and innovation agenda => balanced research and innovation agenda

## Africa and Europe cooperation in building a sustainable African agri-food sector, Tom Arnold, EU commission task force for rural Africa

There has been an increase of the relations between Europe and Africa. For example, the African Union commission and the European Union commission meet every year.

Africa is a continent which will face many changes over the next decades. Indeed, it's a diverse continent divided in 3 main regions: North Africa, Sub-Saharan Africa and South Africa. Its population has doubled over the past 30 years and is projected to double again by 2050. It will face challenges concerning nutrition, education and health. To achieve it, four long term recommendations has been made during the 3rd African-EU agricultural ministerial meeting in June 2019:

- To adopt a territorial approach in planning for income and job creation
- Sustainable land and natural resource management and climate action
- Development of the African food industry and food markets at 3 levels: people to people, business to business, government to government

It is important to define the future political relationship between Africa and Europe. As the Cotonou agreement end up in 2020.

### Overview of the challenges facing European agricultural and life science universities, and do they see their development to 2030, Alex Evans university college of Dublin

The challenge of the universities:

- The issues are more and more multidisciplinary: there is more and more to learn
- Hire the best people to do the best research “war for talent”
- Have the best facilities and equipment
- Funding model are changing

The global challenge in agriculture:

- Climate change diseases
- Anti-microbial resistance
- Growing population: 9.8 million people by 2050

The challenge the emerge from these two areas:

- Be more international but travel less
- Be more collaborative but more business like
- Be more elitist (to have the best people) but more inclusive

### Agrinatura: European and African life science universities – Structures and aims of partnerships

European and African universities have similar goals and problems:

- Attract the brightest students to science/agriculture
- Integrate cutting-edge research with education

The goal of the Agrinatura network is to generate knowledge. They consider that understanding different contexts makes better problem solvers. 35 universities and research organizations from 16 European countries belong to Agrinatura and all of them have many partners.

VCA4D (Value Chain Analysis for Development) is a program created by the European Union where 4 persons from different countries will work together to solve a problem.

During the midday break, we had the occasion to visit the experimental farm of UniLasalle, see some robot prototype build by the students and 3D printing machines.

Figure 1 The world population by 2050

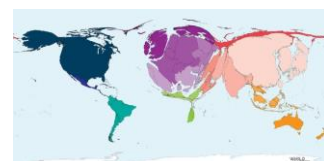


Figure 2 Scientific papers published in 2016

LEA4P: Basis for a common research agenda between European and African life science universities:

- Sustainable intensification
- Agriculture and food systems for nutrition
- Expansion and improvement of agricultural markets and trade
- Common research and innovation area

The goal of the Horizon 2020 program was to boost EU-Africa research and innovation partnerships on food and nutrition security and sustainable agriculture. For example, on the issues of sustainable intensification pathways of agro-food systems in Africa and diversification of revenue in rural Africa through bio-based solution. After this session, there was an intervention from the French agricultural ministry which underlined that cooperation with Africa is important for France.

**LEAP4FNSSA: Towards a Europe Africa research and innovation (R&I) platform for joint action in science, technology and innovation on food and nutrition security and sustainable agriculture (FNSSA), Philippe Petithuguenin, CIRAD, France**

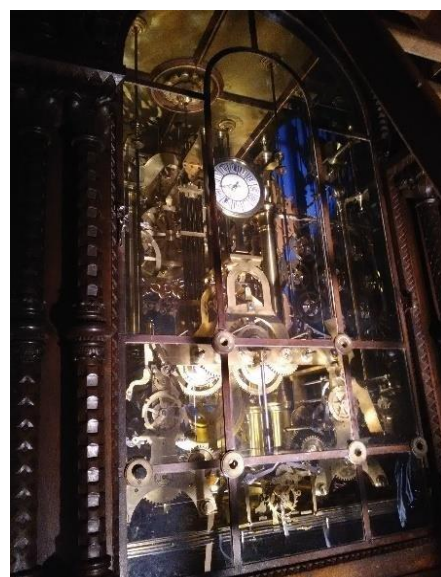
In a partnership, there must be funding and positive impacts on both sides. It is hard to achieve as there are huge differences between socio-economy of Europe and Africa. There are also huge differences between African countries. The partnerships of this program begun between Europe and Maghreb + Egypt but now they want to extend it to West Africa. To achieve it, they need new founding instruments such as private actors but work together is difficult.

The FNSSA roadmap includes a cross-cutting priority on R&I capacity strengthening. The proposed platform will be opened to all European and African universities willing to align their activities to the FNSSA roadmap and to increase their collaboration (between continents and between institutions).

**Building a sustainable model for doctoral training, research and innovation capacity in Sub Saharan Africa: the PASET RSIF, Julius Ecuru, International Center of Insect Physiology and Ecology (ICIPE), Kenya**

The goal of ICIPE and their BioInnovate Africa program is that by 2063 Africa be prosperous, peaceful and contributing to the global development in a sustainable way. The PASET RSIF initiative is a PhD scholar student project. For the first year, 15 students were selected from 1030. For the second year they were 50. The idea is that the student begins its PhD in its African host university, then go to an international partner institution and finally come back to the African host university to achieve its thesis.

### **Austrian – African university network: engagement for mutual benefit for a sustainable future, Hubert Hasenauer, university of natural resources and life sciences, Vienna (BOKU)**

Example 1: Land use change and its consequences for sustainable development in the Amhara region, Ethiopia

Decrease from 40% to 10% of the forest in Ethiopia due to:

- The growing population which depends on forest
- Land use change for agriculture

Removing forest erodes the two topsoil layer which contains about 40% of the C and N pools. Potential reforestation area: 3.4 million ha suitable

Carbon storage if everything is replanted:

- 177 Tg of C in total
- 11 Tg in the soil
- 166 Tg in the above ground

Example 2: Sustainable management of water and fish resources in Burkina Faso

Fish species decrease with the human pressure. There is a high traditional knowledge about water and fishes but little scientific knowledge on water ecology and human impacts.

The BOKU university also do professor and student exchanges, promote joint projects, network and organize conferences.



### **Future EU-African collaboration: What will it take? Achille Assogbadjo, university of Abomey-Calavi, Cotonou**

Africa today:

- GDP grow at rates faster than global since 2015
- The population is getting younger
- It is increasingly urbanising

Universities in Africa today:

- On 30 000 graduated students, 1000 will find a job
- There had been many collaborations between Europe and Africa but there are still problems
- Low scientific activity and mostly concentrated in South Africa

Solutions:

- To focus on STEAM: Science, Technology, Engineering, Agriculture, Mathematics
- To do professional internship programs: after a professional internship 50% of the students get a job where they were working
- Invest in laboratories, start up, do joint publications: they take the example of South Korea whose GDP was less than Soudan in 1961 and more than 20 times superior in 1995 because they invest in new technologies

## Unlocking the hidden potential of Sub-Saharan universities, Pascal Boeckx, Ghent university, Belgium

Constraints for agriculture in Africa:

- Soil and climatic constraint: drought and warming, poor mechanisation, nutrient deficiency
- Economical constraint, for example Nigeria has a weak business potential but a high agronomic potential
- Not enough agricultural research intensity: the attainable investment targets are not reached, the current spending on the continent is 2.5 billion dollars with 1.4 from Nigeria and South Africa and the growth of 0.8 billion between 2000 and 2014 was mainly for salaries
- Aging farmers: 60% in Ghana and 40% in Ethiopia of the farmers are above 50 years old

Opportunities:

- Public-private cooperation fore economic, social and environmentally sustainable commercial crops (cocoa, coffee) but also staple crops (wheat, cassava, maize)
- Improve rural innovation capacity, rehabilitate and maintain infrastructures, create networks
- Twinning sandwich PhD: low investment (150 000 euros) / high gain

## Changing minds and promoting the social-biophysical interface-rethinking South-North academic cooperation, Luis Artur, Eduardo Mondlane university, Mozambique

Agriculture in Africa:

- Low inputs: 5% of farms use certified seeds used, 2.5% use pesticides, 3.75% use fertilizers and 2% have mechanization
- Deforestation is a big problem with 155 000 ha deforested per year within 65% due to agriculture

Good news:

- Africa has by far the strongest growing scientific production
- Astonishing growth of authors (48%)
- More PhD chose to stay in Africa
- More money is going to research

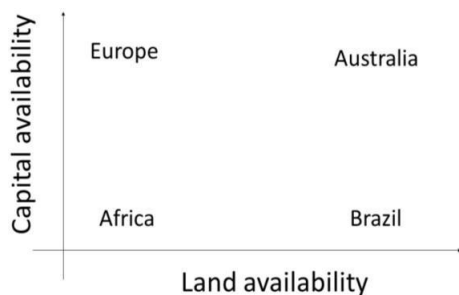
Possible cooperation themes:

- Gender, climate change and agriculture
- Transition from low inputs to high-tech: long term environment and climate change implication
- Global farming mobility and governance in Africa
- Global farming mobility and invasive pests and diseases
- Agri-food chains and African food security

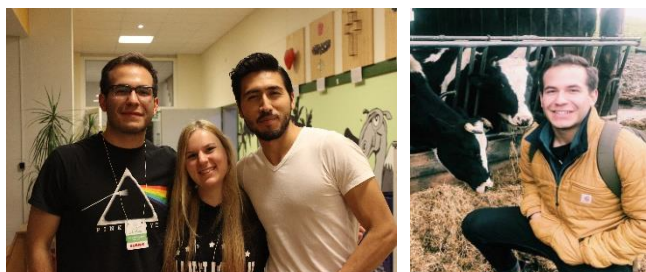

Do you remember the last beer we produced? So, finally we decanted our cask in the Department of Viticulture and Enology in Avellino (AV) with the help of Prof. Giuseppe Blaiotta who always helped us with beer. He also helped us to analyze with microscopes the micropart of the cooked must, seeing the yeasts inside were in partly alive and the other part had finished the fermenting activity and we decided beer will be used for research purposes. Last month we produced a beer and we tried recipe of Weizen beer, but we had a little problem with the yeast, so now we finally understood the fermentative capacity of the *Brettanomyces* which were used in the Sour, and we decided to use that yeast to restart the fermentative activity of the Weizen. Next step will be put inside the cask Weizen beer and we will wait after one month the results but every day we will carefully follow the fermentation which must be spontaneous due to the yeast already present in the cask. We also will prepare new Starter for the next beer we will produce on March/April and we'll participate to another contest "Birrando Si Impara" in Avellino (AV)

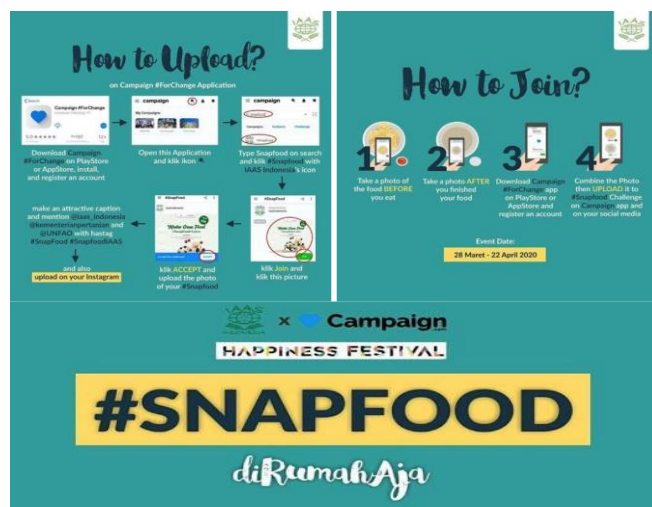


### IAAS Talk with IAAS UGM By IAAS Indonesia March, 2020

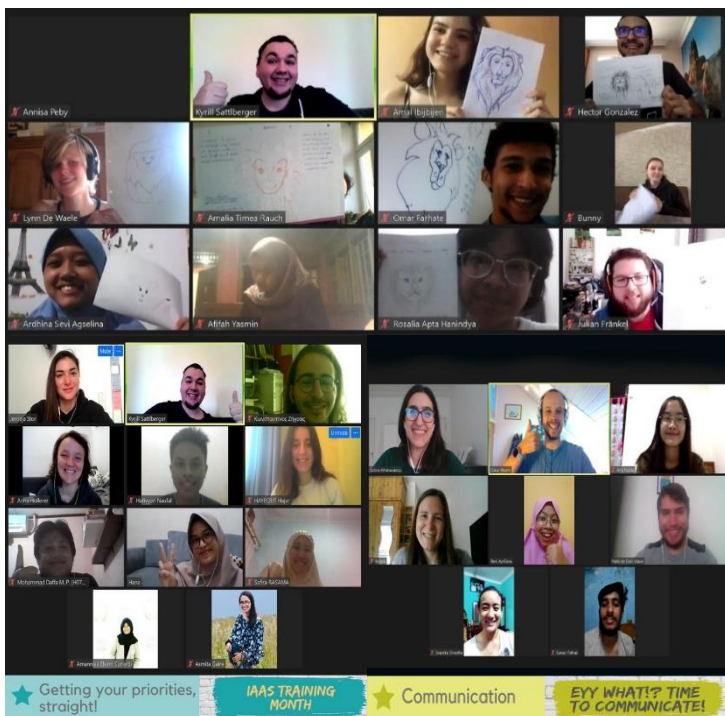

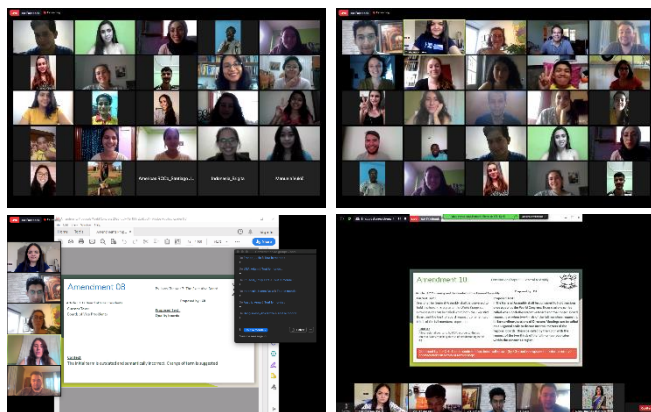

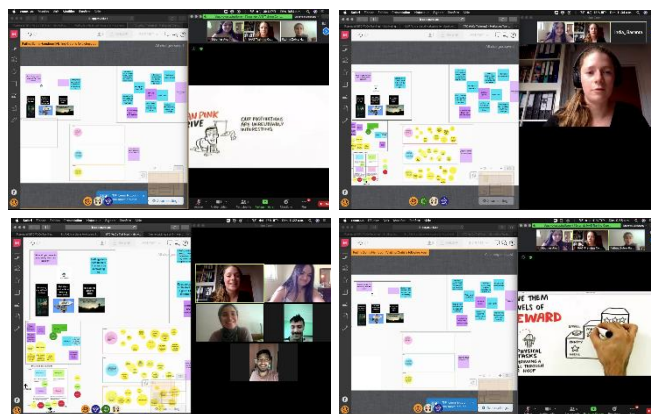




### General Assembly Day 1

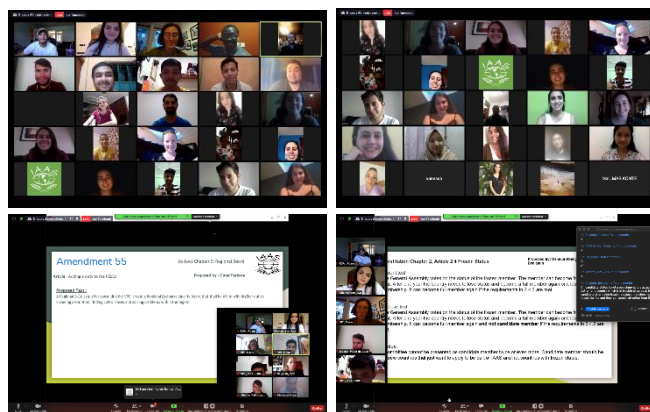
