To express its gratitude towards these rural women, to support them by showing up to the public the realities they strive in daily to feed their families and the population, IAAS TOGO marked the month of March 2018 by a digital campaign of awareness called "MARCH, WOMEN' MONTH". In all, 14 images containing various information were broadcast on the main Whatsapp and Facebook digital channels with an interval of 2 days between each publication.

This campaign generated a lot of interest and positive feedback on Facebook and

messages of encouragement to these women on Whatsapp network.

CELEBRATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL DAY OF CIVIL PROTECTION

Every day and around the world, farmers are striving to produce food that will feed more than 7 billion people worldwide. According to FAO estimates in 2017, farmers produced 1,800,000 tons of food. However, this layer of population to whom we all owe recognition, remains the most vulnerable to the impacts of natural disasters.

When a natural disaster strikes rural areas, it is crops that are destroyed, hectares of flooded land, mainly farmers who are displaced; it is chaos that remains because prevention, security and early warning measures are lacking. To mark the 28th anniversary of the World Day for Civil Protection, celebrated every 1st March, IAAS-TOGO members participated in a training and exchange workshop between actors involved in this field, organized by the National Agency of Civil Protection (ANPC-TOGO).

Placed on the theme:

"CIVIL PROTECTION AND NATIONAL
INSTITUTIONS FOR MORE EFFECTIVE
MANAGEMENT OF DISASTERS"

this workshop was held at the Hotel Concorde in Lomé and was chaired by the Minister of Security and Civil Protection, **Colonel Yark Damhane** in the presence of the Resident Representative of the United Nations System in Togo, **Mrs. Khardiata Lo N'Diaye**.

The objective was to sensitize and train the public in the civil protection concept, but especially to exchange with actors on how to maintain and safeguard civil protection in order to manage the threats of crises and natural



disasters in Togo. On the same day, an awareness caravan focused on disaster risk reduction led by members of IAAS- TOGO.

CELEBRATION OF INTERNATIONAL WOMEN' DAY

AT THE AMERICAN CORNER: THE UNIVERSITY TEDx



IAAS-TOGO Executive Board spared no effort in celebrating World Women' Day. The aim this year was to introduce the young members of the association to the talents they own and transform them into role models for their high school and college sisters.

IAAS TOGO celebrated March 8 this year by participating in the first ever TEDx University organized by the American Corner Fan Club. In all, 15 girls from the association members of the local committee IAAS-University of Lomé took part. This celebration was focused on series of discussion between women leaders, true models of women, like the Second Vice-President of the University of Lomé; the TEDx promoter; the Representative of the United States Ambassador in Togo and young scientists women. Through this exchange session between girls and women leader, the science complex has been demystified in young girls mind. And they return home more motivated than ever to encourage their little sisters to embrace science courses as early as high school.

The Second Vice-President of the University of Lomé reminded girls that *"doing sciences is like cooking; just know, cut, admix, and mix to get a good result."* And that *"in science disciplines, the secret to success is work; you have to work, work and work again"*. She ends her speech by reminding girls that *"there is no one in sciences and you just have to get interested in it to succeed"*.

The promoter of the TEDx, **Miss Nadège AFOUTOU** spoke to her young sisters about the importance of immersing themselves in the effective use of New Information and Communication Technologies (NTICs). She wished to remind us that the "African continent can only develop if we Africans young boys and girls impregnate more with their effective use for our academic and professional training.

Furthermore, the Representative of the United States Ambassador and her Public Affairs Officer encouraged in their speeches all the youth to take examples of model person who succeeded despite the precarious situation they went through.

The celebration of the International Women' Day at the American Corner ended with a session of sharing experiences during which young scientists women shared their stories with the participants.

AT THE INSTITUT CONFUCIUS: THE CINE-DEBATE

The Pro-CEMA (Program of Consolidation of the State and the Associative World) celebrated, the International Women' Day this 8th March around a cine-debate organized at the Confucius Institute of the University of Lomé. A meeting that brought together women' organizations from different horizons and during which two enough interesting movies were screened. **Miss Rosaline TSEKPUA** and **Miss Natacha Akoko AKPADJA**, two leader girls of the local committee IAAS-University of Lomé, participated in this celebration day.

The first movie entitled *"WOMEN AND MEN"* is a documentary that shows why women' rights are a crucial issue for the future of humanity. He looks closely at the inequalities that persist between the two sexes and reveals the surprising socio-economic benefits that would empower women. In addition, the film addresses the subject from a historical, economic and cultural perspective by giving voice to international speakers specializing in women' issues.

The second one titled *"MOM (S)"*, evokes the difficulties faced by women facing polygamy in their homes. This is the story of Aida, an eight-year-old girl living in the suburbs of Paris, who sees the daily life of her entire family upset the day her father returns from his trip to Senegal, their country of origin, accompanied by a young Senegalese whom he presents as his second wife. Faced with the



distress of her mother, the girl decides to get rid of her stepmother.

The participants, mostly women, believe that Pro-CEMA's cine-debate was an opportunity for them to identify some important concepts they did not know before.

The 4 IAAS OPEN CLASSES were a real success due to the enthusiasm of the target audience and the relevance of the various topics developed. For the majority of participants, it is the initiative's original approach that impresses them and, moreover, their satisfaction at each of the various sessions. Finally, on the one hand, it is an opportunity for them to express themselves and to express their point of view on topics that are important for youth they were not used to discussing and, on the other hand, an effective moment for acquaintance and practices on various topics.

IAAS OPEN CLASS #1

SOCIAL NETWORKS AND PERSONAL BRANDING

The first-ever IAAS OPEN CLASS was held on *June 15, 2018* in ESA4. The aim was to teach participants how to professionally use the Facebook social network for their own "personal branding" and thus increase their



personality towards internet users and potential future employers.

This hands-on training session was attended by approximately 15 students and was jointly delivered by the IAAS-UL and IAAS-TOGO Communication and Membership Department.

IAAS OPEN CLASS #2

ENTREPRENDRE, A GOOD THING – BUT WHAT ARE THE SECTORS OF INTEREST IN AGRI-ENTREPRENEURSHIP?

Nowadays, agri-entrepreneurship is an effective way to reduce the unemployment that plagues Togolese youth. This explains the struggle of the authorities in charge of youth employment issues to look into incentive policies in agricultural sector and to take measures to ease business creation. However, any young person who wants to enter the agricultural sector encounters the question of which sector or which level of the value chain to position? In this vein, the second IAAS OPEN CLASS was organized in order to provide the participants students a clear perspective on the various promising sectors of the Togolese agricultural sector so that they could better manage their personal entrepreneurial choices.

This session was held by the Project Department of IAAS-UL and supported by the IAAS-TOGO Communication Department. A total of thirty students from various schools and faculties of the university campus of Lomé took part.



IAAS OPEN CLASS #3 CINE-DEBATE ON FOOD WASTE

The issue of food waste remains a matter of concern to major institutions such as the World Food Program (WFP) and the United Nations Food and Agriculture Fund (FAO). What is behind this hot topic? Are we concerned in Africa? What will be youth students particularly IAAS members contribution as future decision makers to reverse the trend? Here are some of the questions that animated the film-documentary on food waste followed by a workshop and a debate on the subject during the 3rd IAAS OPEN CLASS 30th June 2018 in the ESA4 room organized by the Production, Manufacturing, Conservation and Marketing (PTCC) Department of IAAS-UL.

IAAS OPEN CLASS #4 REFLECTION WORKSHOP ON FOOD WASTE REDUCTION



The issue of food waste was partially debated during the third IAAS OPEN CLASS on June 30. Questions still remain and one wonders what is the level of commitment of current youth students on this subject? Are we really wasting food in Africa and especially in Togo? How and why? What link can there be between food waste and hunger? What ideas or projects could be executed to mitigate these two scourges: hunger and food waste?

To all these questions, the 4th IAAS OPEN CLASS organized on Saturday 07th July 2018 in the ESA4 room, did not fail to be a very exciting sharing and debate session around a screening of two documentaries illustrating these two scourges and reflecting on the subject. In all, the session counted 49 young ambassadors of the **"No Food Waste Program"**. They were regrouped in six groups of participatory reflections resulting in 6 projects to fight against hunger and food waste on the Lomé university campus and in their various communities.

RECRUITMENT SEMINAR FOR NEW IAAS-UL MEMBERS

DEBATE COMPETITION

IAAS GHANA
April 30th, 2018

Kuapa Kooko and Millennium Promise Alliance organized a National Debate Competition between 8 top universities in Ghana: KNUST, UCC, UEW-K, GIMPA, UPSA, UG-LEGON, ASHESI and CHRISTIAN SERVICE. The first round of Debate was held in Accra on 30th April 2018. IAAS-KNUST represented KNUST with Mr.Opey Abednego Brandy, Mr.Frank Bannerman and Miss Emmanuella Oheneba Cobbinah (all IAAS Members) as the main debaters with some other members forming the team. We had our first debate with University of Ghana-Legon, of which we won with a percentage over 85.

We qualified to the finale round of the competition with UCC, UEW-K, GIMPA and KNUST as possible winners of the debate. The final debate was held at the Kempinski Hotel Gold Coast City, Accra on 30th May 2018. The team led by the Debate Coordinator Mr. Atta Kusi Gilbert brought victory to IAAS-KNUST and KNUST at large. The final debate was between UCC and KNUST debating on the topic: "Successive Government have discriminated against cocoa farmers by not instituting a pension scheme for them in spite of their contribution to Ghana's economy since independence". KNUST beat UCC with a slim margin of 76.11%-KNUST, 75.6%-UCC. The 3 debaters won laptop computers each, medals of participation, 1 year internship with KKFU and

Millennium Promise and a cash prize. On 4th June 2018, the Vice Chancellor honored the 3 debaters by providing accommodation at the SRC Hostel. Members who want to join the debate team should see the Debate Coordinator for more details.

They motivate the children also helps them in their study. The children of EDS became very happy to pass few time with them.



IAAS BANGLADESH "LET'S GO TO VILLAGE" FIELD TRIP

August 15th, 2018



On the 15th August, IAAS Bangladesh arranged a field trip having the theme "Let's Go to Village". Total 15 members of IAAS Bangladesh along with the National Director have participated in the trip. The motive of the tour was to reach the farmers and directly discuss with them about their problems and relevant solutions.

At first, the team visited the local office of sustainability association Solidaridad and their Sustainable Agricultural Food and Security (SAFAL) which is situated at Dumuria Upazila, Khulna in Bangladesh. They took part in a discussion meeting with the officers of SAFAL and gathered information about the intention, structure, methodology and success of SAFAL.



After visiting the local office of SAFAL, Chowdhury Rajib, field officer of SAFAL, guided them during visiting the Bamundia village, Tipna of Dumuria Upazila in order to meeting the local farmers. Mr. Jahidul Islam, the National Director of IAAS Bangladesh then directly discussed with the local farmers about different things related with



agriculture. They said that they don't keep their land fallow at any time if the year. In order to increasing the productivity of the land, they use chemical fertilizers as well as organic fertilizers. They cultivate eggplant, leafy vegetables, cabbage, cauliflower etc. along with rice. The most important thing is that they are ready to accept any new technology which will increase the production. Then the N.D. of IAAS Bangladesh has ensured them to contact with IAAS Bangladesh without any delay, whenever they face any problems.



Local farmers have said that they are being benefited by using organic fertilizer in their field. The importance of using vermicompost was discussed then. Team IAAS Bangladesh then visited several vegetables fields of them. Md. Nuruzzaman, the president of Bamundia local farmers Committee has informed that he participated in a training programme of SAFAL about vermicompost. He started to produce vermicompost with he helps of only 25 earthworms and 10 pots at the initial stage. Now there are approximately 2.5 m earthworms in his stock. In order to produce vermicompost at first, cow dung is kept fallow to remove bad odour. Then the special type earthworms are added with the rotten and odour free cow dung in pots. He sells his vermicompost at a rate of 12tk per kg.

After that they visited the "Village Supper Market" (VSM) constructed by SAFAL project which is situated at Tipna in Dumuria Upazila. The market was inaugurated on 6th September, last year. Local farmers sell their products (fishes, vegetables and



milk) in the market at wholesale price. After determining the quality of the products following digital methods and packaging, they are directly exported in several foreign countries. There are cold storage facilities, ice processing unit, fish storage facilities, milk processing unit in the market. Then the members of IAAS Bangladesh have visited the fish farm of the local UP member Mr. Mohsin Hossain.

IAAS Bangladesh has ensured that they will continue such kind of programmes.

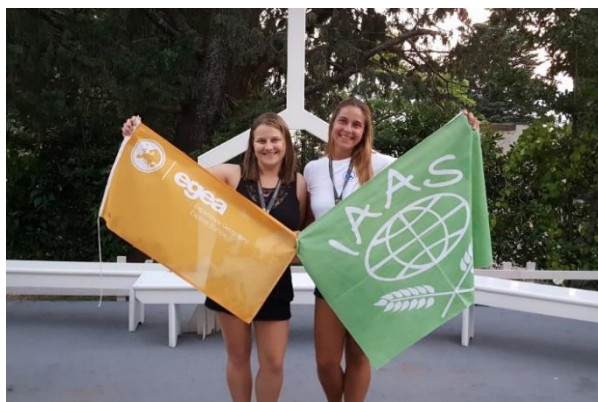

On a wonderful sunny Tuesday, 18th of September 2018, almost 200 EGEA members and one IAASer came together in Rijeka, Croatia for the opening ceremony of the 31st EGEA Annual Congress- #AC2018. After a wonderful opening speeches and lectures from the AC moved to the venue situated in a small Croatian coastal city called Selce.

With the central topic "Realize rural-understand it and make it happen", members of EGEA developed many interesting workshops, lectures, trainings, excursions and a scientific debate to follow the topic.

The key idea of this year annual congress was to research of an extremely problematic area both in Croatia and in Europe, the rural area. We are all aware of the negative processes affecting rural areas, such as depopulation, marginalization, unequal regional development, poor quality of life, inaccessibility of central functions etc. Because of this, one must be aware of the necessity to invest in programmes and measures which would halt these negative processes.

Through this topic their aim was for everyone to realize an importance of rural areas and the lifestyle of the local population and use our knowledge to contribute to rural revival. The issues was analysed through six key subtopics: Synergy as driving energy – the role of civic engagement and the participatory approaches, Nature (still) rules! Impact of physical-geographical features in countryside, Rural tourism as an actor of rural change, Agriculture – going global or reviving local?, Rural-urban partnerships – bridging the gap, Innovative rural areas – step forward?

Even though the programme was filled with the topic related activities, as it was an annual congress (same as our WoCo), final presentations and reports of the previous board were made, constitution and by-laws, as well as the budget were discussed, and the new boards were announced.



I had the opportunity to conduct a meeting with the people responsible for the partnership, previous and new, and to evaluate the partnership between EGEA and IAAS.

The conclusion was that, as it looks good on the paper and on the international level, we should focus more on the local level, in Europe and promote the collaboration between the associations among members on the local level.

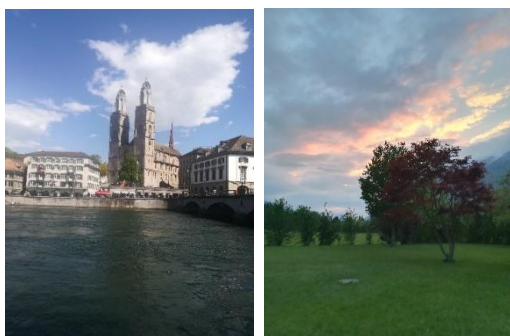

Sunday 29/04/18.



We meet up at the ETH university and get to know each other better or say hi to the friends we've already met before. On the first day they wanted us to get to know Zürich better. The way we had to do that was through the Crazy Challenge. The sun is shining and we set out for the challenge. My biggest challenge however were the great amount of steep hills! We had to climb on statues, ask strangers their birthdays, sing for strangers,... After the challenge (and the challenging climb back up the hill) we left in our vans for Walenstadt. Here we had a scouts-hut all to ourselves. Back to the roots (no Wi-Fi, no free roaming either) but lots of friends and an amazing view. Who could complain?



Monday, 30/04/18.

Field trip day! The main sponsor of the event, **Syngenta**, showed us two typical Swiss farms, one in the mountains, and a "normal" one. The first farm, Herman, are growing hard vegetables and washing, packing and storing them themselves.



They had about 50 hectares of land where they grew potatoes, onions, and carrots. The climate is quite special here, they can have frost until the 10th of may so they might need to cover their plants sometimes but last year they still harvested the 26th of December. So, a quite long growing period.

The second farm was Bergkäserei Mädris. A **cheese** producer up in the mountains. In a little town where only 85 people live with a rough climate (no vineyards) 10 out of the 28 households are farmers. They produce cheese out of the 350 000 litres of Milk they get every year. He showed us around his production and farm and then we got some wine and could taste the cheese. It's a real special feeling to have a cheese and wine tasting so high up, with amazing views of the valley.

We closed of the day by having an amazing **trade fair** where we could taste the food from every country. Unfortunately, they invited Sweden, who

brought Surströmming, and nearly killed us. Kidding, we love you Sweden.

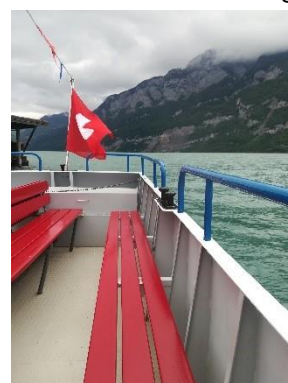
Tuesday, 01/05/2018.

Visit to **Quinten**. Quinten is a small town, only reachable by boat across the lake. The village sides on the mountain and is thus sheltered from the wind (by the mountain) and has the sun on the south side. So, it's always 3-4 degrees warmer here than elsewhere in the valley, which makes it especially great to produce wine. Currently there are only 44 people living here. This city still exists today because of tourism, otherwise it



would have died out already. We walked around the idyllic, quiet town (no cars), visited a herb witch and went up hill to visit the winery. Hamti runs this vineyard all by himself, he not only grows the grapes but so has pigs and donkeys. The pigs looked like sheep, honestly, so fluffy. Since the wine is quite special, because it is grown in such a weird environment and he packaged it in a nice story, the business is going great and he got a 5/5 rating on vino.com. After showing us around, Hamti gave us the wine to taste while he made us risotto. Amazing.

In the afternoon we had a part of our **soft skill training** about giving **pitches**. How should you structure a pitch? How do you give feedback? How to deal with stage fear? How to improvise? And practising pitches. Very useful skills for now and later.



We closed of the day with a barbecue outside on the fire. Do you know that in Switzerland they cut open bananas, put chocolate in, wrap them in aluminium foil and throw them in the fire? Very weird and tasty!

Wednesday, 02/05/18.

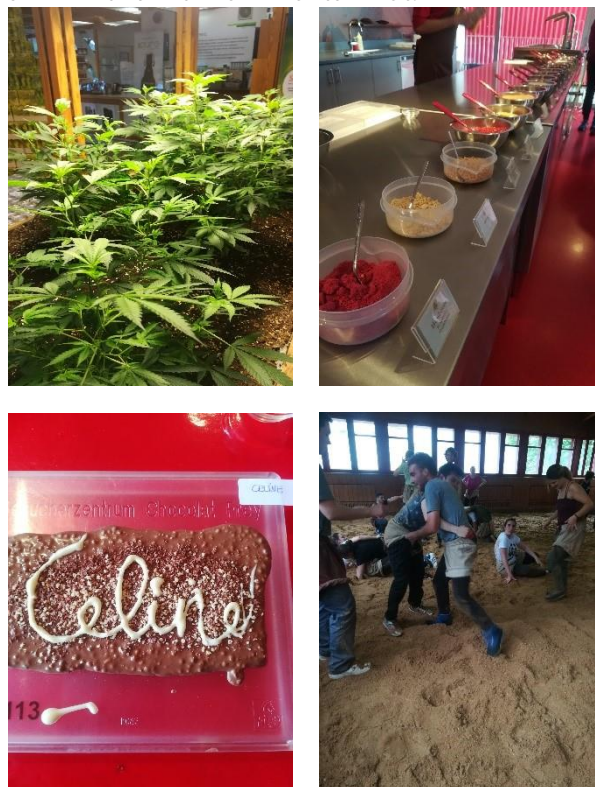
Let's go for a **hike** they said, it'll be fun they said. Yeah, these mountain goats (Swiss people) might be used to it, but I'm not, and I live in the Vlaamse Ardennen, the hilly part of Flanders. We formed a slow army with some people and tried to follow the others. Finally we arrived at the lake where we had our lunch. The views were amazing, the nature, lake and surroundings, so cool. The way my legs felt after even 3 steps was not that amazing. But pushing through we made it to the top to have lunch and wine and enjoy the view. The highest



point we were on was 1100 meters. Higher than Belgium, amazing, right? We closed of the day by showering (it was quite necessary) and having a raclette evening!



Next up was the **spring party** in ETH, where we had vegan, gluten-free and insects for dinner. It was definitely an experience. We chilled some more and went back to our mountain hut.



Thursday, 03/05/18.



Field trip to a **hemp** farm. By which I mean, a legal weed farm in Switzerland. In Switzerland it is legal to have weed if it has less than 1% of THC in it, THC is the psychoactive part. In Europe for example it is legal if it has less than 0.2%. They recently found a way to achieve that and will start selling

their products in Europe this summer (www.pureproduction.ch). Here they are actively breeding against THC and for CBD, which has a lot of great uses (sleeping, calming,...). They showed us around the production and the quality testing lab and then we could enter the shop and try some of their products.

After chilling and relaxing, we took the cars back to Zurich to have our 2nd part of the training. Here we focused on our body and voice and practised our **body language**. After which we had to deliver our final pitch about our favourite national food. Guess what mine was? Hahaha yes, potatoes, oh you know me so well.

Friday, 04/05/18.

Chocolate factory Frey. We had a workshop where we could make our own chocolate bars. Then an audio tour of the factory and tasting the chocolates. I was in chocolate heaven (even though it was swiss chocolate). With a full belly we went to Zurich to practice the swiss national sport, **Schwingeren**. Which is basically wearing weird underpants, grabbing each other by them and throwing the other on their backs in the sawdust. Looked weird, was loads of fun. Cleaning out the dust was less fun though. We then had a rice bowl and chilled near the river before going to a party.

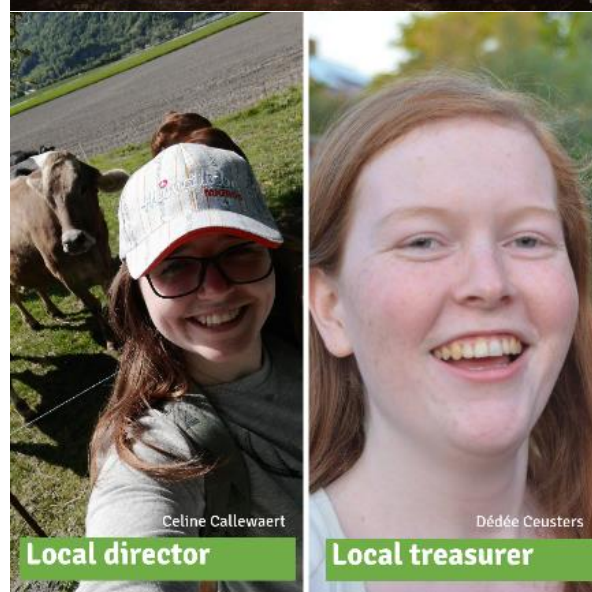

Nancy, France

From the 12th to the 18th March we organized the Exco meeting in France on the theme of "Let's innovate and preserve traditions through sustainable development". We hosted 2 Austrians, 2 Belgians, 1 Bulgarian, 1 Ivorian, 3 Croatians including the Regional Director of Europe Lan Rajlić,



2 Germans including the Vice President of Exchange Paulina Elena Manthey, the Ghanaian Regional Exchange Coordinator of Africa Calvin Nelson, 3 Greeks, 1 Indonesian, the Kenyan Regional Director of Africa Laurine Chirry, 2 Polishes, 1 Portuguese, 3 Serbians, the Slovenian Regional Exchange Coordinator of Europe Jerneja Štor, 2 Swisses, 2 Tunisians, the American Head of Control Board Natalie Bidner and 1 Zimbabwean.

On the first day we had a tour of Nancy (where the committee is located) and especially of the Stanislas place; we ended the day with ice-breakers games at our hostel.



The second day, we presented our engineering school, the National Superior School of Agriculture and Food Industries (ENSAIA) to our guests whom presented their universities to the French students. Then, we had a buffet offered by our sponsor: Agreenium which is the French Association of Engineers in Agronomic and Food Industries.



In the afternoon, we attended the first General Assembly of the week: everybody expressed their expectations of the Exco meeting, we had a presentation of what the Exchange Programm (ExPro) is, how to apply to it and all the regions presented their goals toward the ExPro. All the General Assemblies of the week have been led by Paulina Elena Manthey and Natalie Bidner from IAAS world. After we all cooked dishes from our country and had the traditional Trade Fair!



The third day, we had two sessions of World Café, of one hour each. There was four topics about ExPro, and we split into four groups to discuss about



these topics, and we could change and go to another table whenever we wanted to. In the afternoon, groups of around 5 people had to work on a topic, related to the issues we talked about in the morning.



The fourth day, we had a training in the morning, and in the afternoon, we listened to the presentations about that we had work on the day before. At night, we watched a movie about familial farming around the world made by French students from another engineering school in agronomy.

The last two days were dedicated to visits. First, we visited a traditional brewery. Afterward,



we went to the experimental farm of our school, La Bouzule, and his director presented to our guests the methanation unit, the crops (agroforestry to produce alfalfa, forage, nettle for fabrics) and the



cattle (cows for meat and milk and goats to produce cheese). He enlightened the efforts made to produce raw materials for the food industry with no chemicals or GMO as well as producing bioenergy. In the evening, we had a Development Fund auction which raised 600€ (about \$737).



The next day we visited a biological and biodynamic vineyard and the winemaking room associated to it located in the European biggest building made of wood and straw (which doesn't need more than a small fire to stay warm). Later, we reached Strasbourg for a tour of the city under the snow. In the evening we all had a last moment together in an Irish pub for the Saint Patrick Day.



We all enjoyed this week together in France spent to improve the ExPro.

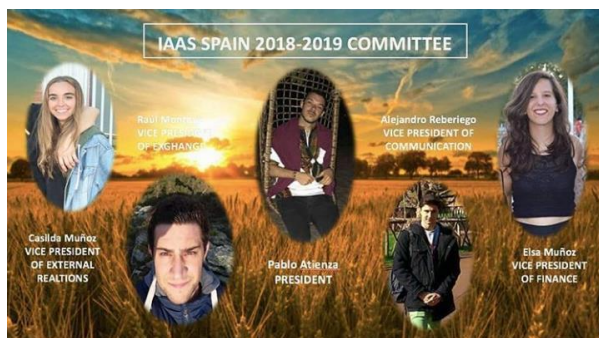
We are currently working on the No Food Waste project by creating posters (like we planned during the WoCo).

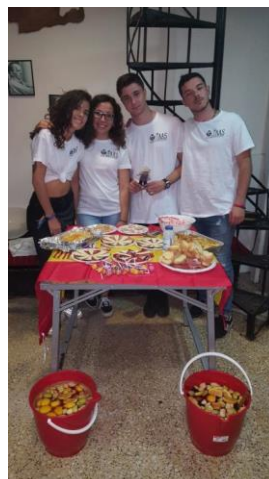

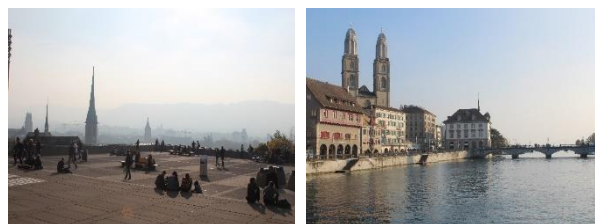

Three different **presentations** were planned during the noon. The first one was from Christine Gould about [Thought for food](#). It was the first time that I



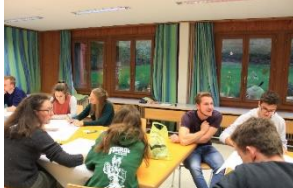

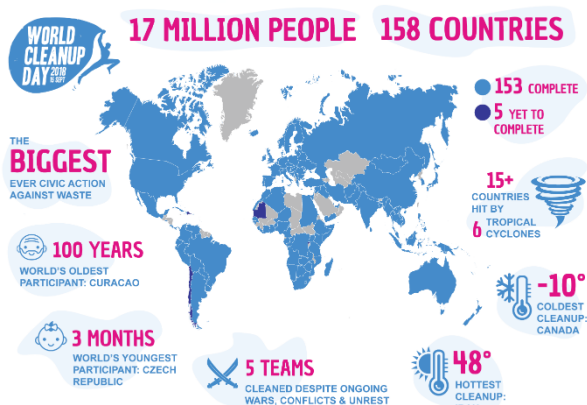




WORLD CLEAN UP DAY 2018 So Much Cigarettes

Why should we clean the trash? Won't it just decompose by itself?

Well no, not really, check out this picture with estimated times until it's gone!



Crazy right?

We as youth have the **responsibility** to take care of ourselves, other people but surely also our mother earth. So some of our members went to the coast to clean it up.



We went to the event from the Propere Strandlopers, this is a citizen initiative where citizens from all over the coast are cleaning monthly, weekly even daily when they take a walk. This summer alone they found over 13 000 liters of trash.



On World Clean Up day at our Belgian coast 554 people cleaned 45 km of coastline and found **7.570 liters of trash**. Right here you can see which items are the top 10 of found litter in Europe. This could also be seen on our coast since we ourselves found countless amounts of cigarettes, plastic pieces and polystyrene.



Some tips to reduce ocean waste:

Reduce your use of single-use plastics

Carry around a water bottle, have your own cutlery with you, have a lunch box, say no to straws, use reusable shopping bags (yes even for vegetables and fruits there are other options).

Recycle properly

Know what to throw where and sort paper from organics from plastics (PMD) from rest.

Participate in a Clean-up

There are many clean up groups or events all over the world, participate in it once and see how amazing it makes you feel to help. Or whenever you go on a walk take at least 3 pieces of trash with you and dispose of it properly.

Support bans

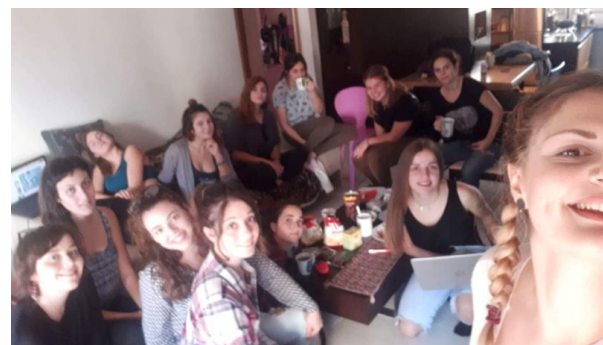


NEW YEAR ACADEMIC OF IAAS GREECE

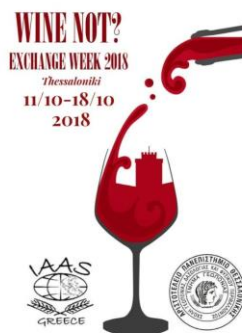
IAAS GREECE LC THESSALONIKI EXCHANGE WEEK "WINE NOT?"

In addition to receiving a high quality education, you will enjoy the cultural and recreational opportunities of many European cities and nature.

Master in Horticultural Sciences

Horticultural Sciences are an integrated discipline which focuses on the humans' needs always keeping sustainability in mind. In future this calls for an increased interdisciplinary understanding of plant production, wellbeing, nutrition and environment; and furthermore cost effectiveness is required throughout. Graduates are to contribute to

providing consumers with healthy, safe products of high quality.

Master Programme Organic Agricultural Systems and Agroecology (AgrEco-Organic) and Organic Agricultural Systems and Agroecology (EUR-Organic)

The production, processing and marketing of organically grown food requires special skills and knowledge. To meet this demand the English-Taught master programme Organic Agricultural Systems and Agroecology was designed and offers an education related to all aspects of the organic sector and agroecology.

Master in Water Management and Environmental Engineering (WMEE)

The English-taught study program "WMEE" provides knowledge about processes of water transport in the environment and its linkages to the environmental systems. Know-how for design and development of technical solutions for water supply, purification and sectoral demands is gained. Knowledge for recognition, prevention and recovery of water related risks like floods and droughts as well as risks related to alpine hazard processes like landslides, avalanches or rockfall is imparted.

Master of Science in Aquaculture

The Master of Science in Aquaculture is a two-year master program that prepares you to become a highly trained and skilled expert who is able to





exploit existing aquaculture potentials in a profitable and sustainable way and to draw and implement strategies for future development in the aquaculture industry. Graduates from all over the world will be able to act as key persons in their own local environment as the program strongly stimulates the transfer of knowledge between Europe and developing countries.

Master of Science in Environmental Sanitation

The Master of Science in Environmental Sanitation is a two-year master program that aims to train environmental experts who have a good knowledge of all compartments and processes of the environment (soil, water, air), who can make use of integrated insights and multidisciplinary approaches in environmental science and technology, and who can combine preventive and remediation instruments to support a sustainable exploitation of the environment. Graduates are active in diverse sectors and assume highly varying professional duties, varying from jobs in ministries and governmental services, NGOs, teaching assignments at universities or scientific research in domains that deal with technologies for prevention and sanitation of environmental pollution.

Master of Science in Food Technology

The Master of Science in Food Technology is a two-year master program that builds on the integrated expertise in research and education of KU Leuven and UGent in the field of food technology. It offers two years of academic education, leading to a MSc degree 'Master of Science of Food Technology'. During the first year, in-depth knowledge in food science, engineering and food engineering is obtained. The second year of the MSc program provides a broad knowledge in food technology and in-depth understanding in either 'Postharvest or Food Preservation Engineering' (PFPE) or 'Food Science and Technology' (FST), depending on the major chosen.

Master of Science Nutrition and Rural Development

The Master of Science in Nutrition and Rural Development is a two-year international Master program with two majors 'Public Health Nutrition' and 'Nutrition Security and Management'. This program trains specialists capable of determining a nutrition related problem in a population, analyzing its determinants and defining and evaluating integrated policies. Program development builds heavily on high quality research and evidence based approaches to contribute to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

Master of Science Physical Land Resources

The Master of Science in Physical Land Resources is a two-year master program that aims at delivering

experts with a broad, advanced up-to-date knowledge in the field of physical land resources and soils in particular, that are capable to integrate this knowledge with the acquired techniques, skills and attitudes, and to apply them in their professional life. Special consideration is given to analyzing problems in developing countries.

International Master of Science in Sustainable and Innovative Natural Resource Management (SINReM)

The International Master of Science in Sustainable and Innovative Natural Resource Management (SINReM) is a two-year master program. It educates a new range of resource engineer professionals by focusing on developing concepts and technology along the value chain of raw materials to make it more sustainable. The graduates will be T-shaped professionals with a holistic view on the entire value chain with deep knowledge on one particular aspect and a highly entrepreneurial mind-set with a strong focus on innovation.

International Master of Science in Environmental Technology and Engineering (IMETE)

In the two-year IMETE Erasmus Mundus master program you will become part of a new generation of environmental scientists. As a graduate, you will be able to design and apply state-of-the-art environmental technology and engineering solutions to tackle today's global environmental problems.

International Master of Science in Rural Development (IMRD)

IMRD, part of the Erasmus Mundus scholarship program, is a joint master degree which offers you the opportunity to study rural development in its diversity of international approaches and applications. The two-year master program (120 ECTS) is jointly organized by 12 institutes leading in agricultural economics and rural development from all over the world. IMRD offers a combination of basic and specialized theoretical and practical training in technical, economic and social sciences. This competitive master program has a high extent of international student mobility, making it possible to learn from specialists worldwide.





With 19 BSc programmes, 31 master's programmes and several online MSc programmes, Wageningen University & Research is the world's leading supplier of scientific education in the healthy food and living environment domain.
