

Like-minded people and organizations.



Types of program



An IAAS internship which organized in farms either in crop production or livestock. The types that include as Ceres are: Agricultural Machinery; Food Technology; Agricultural Production; Forestry; Greenhouse; Horticulture. Mainly, participants will implement their hard skills such as planting, harvesting, controlling the processes in industry, and even working alongside seasoned farmers.

An IAAS internship involves working on research institutes, laboratories, management, education, and engineering. Participants can take part in research activities that require specific skills for researching, teaching a subject in a foreign environment, gain experience in agribusiness administrative, and implementing technical processes in agro-engineering.

An IAAS internship that focuses on volunteering internship. This involves village development and rural empowerment in the field of education, environmental, agricultural, and community development.



Village Concept Project

Village Concept Projects or VCPs are large-scale development projects in rural villages with a measurable social impact and a direct contribution to the SDG 2030. The VCPs are fully organized and implemented by youth and students' organizations all over the world. As the name implies, VCP means activities or projects undertaken to make a village progress and develop in accordance with the changing times without eliminating the cultural values and customs that exist in the local area. VCP itself has 3 main objectives in developing a village, namely Education, Environment and Community Development.



The VCP is directly contributing to these specific SDGs.





IDP is a platform that strives towards prosperous deltas by:

- 1) facilitating and supporting locally- and youth-led projects in deltas
- 2) stimulating peer-to-peer learning globally and locally
- 3) contributing to upholding agricultural livelihoods in deltas worldwide
- 4) working towards sustainable, resilient and water-secure deltas
- 5) being a cross-sectoral bridge between countries, stakeholders and generations

IDP directly contributes to SDG 6 and SDGs 2,8,9,14 by its difficult activities around the globe and representations in different conferences.

This project is directly contributing to these specific SDGs.




