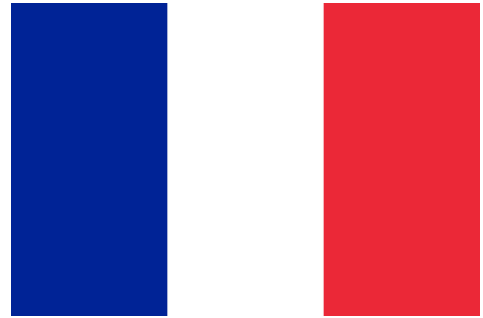
IAAS WORLD

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IAAS FRANCE

2. Getting to know IAAS / Cooking event

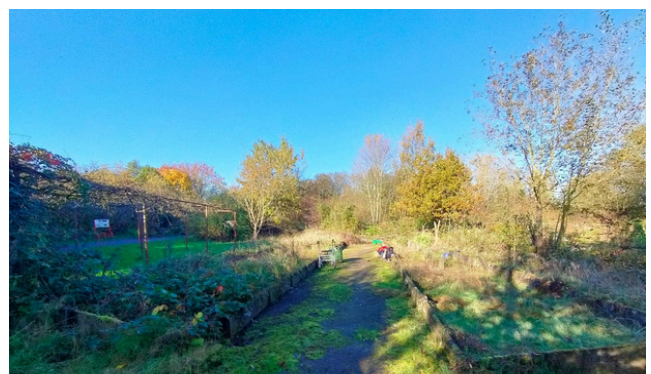
(24th October 2024 Bonn, Germany)

October 2024 Bonn, Germany

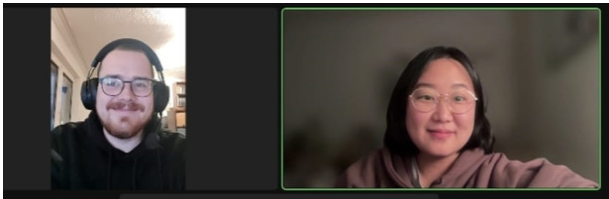

1. AgroCroatia

(September 30th – October 5th)
(Gorski kotar – Rijeka – island of Krk, Croatia)

We organized our fourth AgroCroatia seminar. We had 6 wonderful days of traveling, lectures and visits to companies.

On the first day (Monday, September 30th), we started our journey from Zagreb to Gorski kotar.

We had a lecture on Local Action Group Gorski kotar and their activities. We ended the day with Trade Fair.

On the second day (Tuesday, October 1st), we visited the Fruit Processing Facility, the Large Carnivores Museum and the Borovnica company and workshop. On the third day (Wednesday, October 2nd), we went to the city of Rijeka, where we had a lecture on the aromas and sensory analysis of wine, beer and honey and we visited Morčić brewery.

On the fourth day (Thursday, October 3rd), we went to Vrbnik (Krk island) where we visited Katunar winery and Gospoja prosciutto production and winery and we had a lecture (and tasting) from the owner of KuSssh company and plantation.

On the fifth day (Friday, October 4th), we visited *Magriž* family farm and the oil mill in Bor camp in Krk.

On the last day of the seminar (Saturday, October 5th), we visited *Lynx* Craft Distillery owned by one of our professors at the Faculty of Agriculture and his wife.

Summary: 10 different locations, 12 visits, 33 people, together with IAAS Greece (2 members) and IAAS Hungary (3 members).

1. Dashain and Tihar Lottery Announcement (October 7th, 2024)

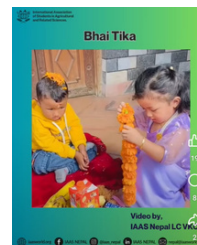
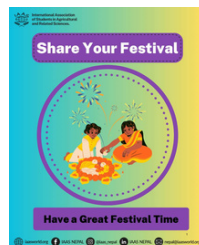

(7 th October, 2024) (Online)

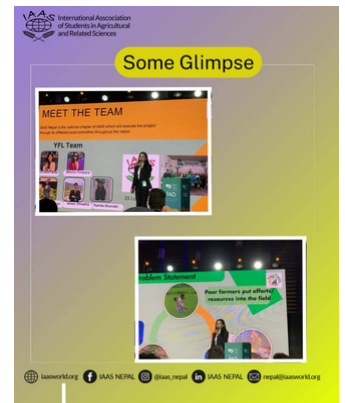

This is a valuable resource for rice farmers, agricultural students, and anyone interested in effective crop protection techniques.

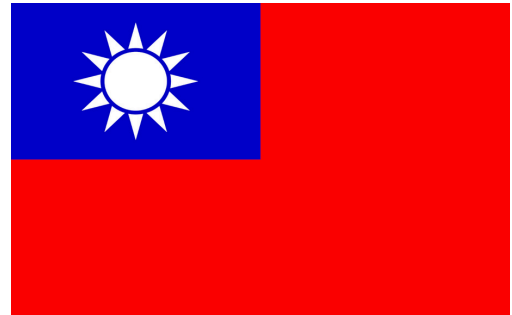
