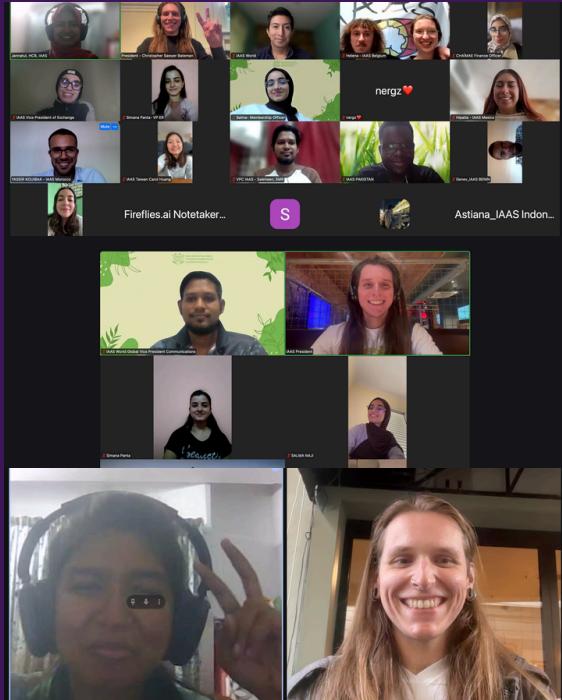

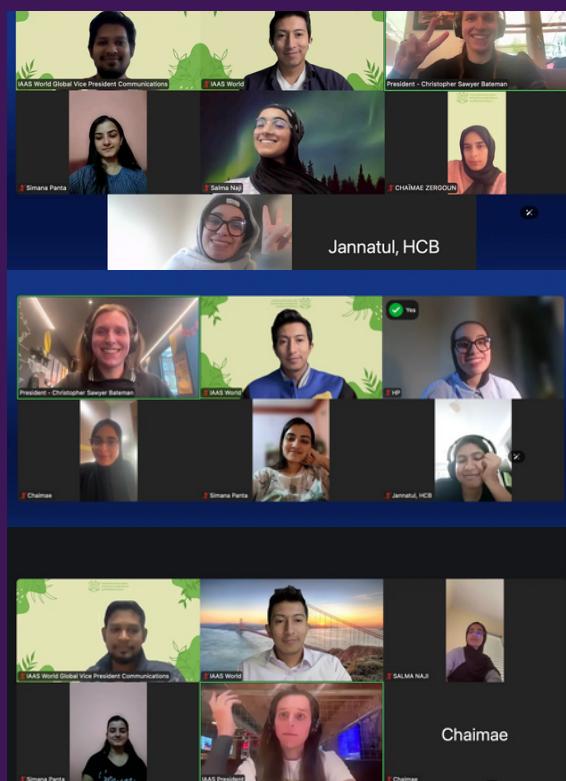

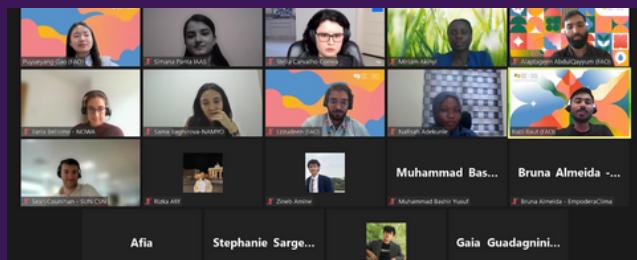
This marks just the beginning of what we envision as a year of growth, inclusion, and strengthened partnerships for IAAS World.
